Organisation

- Stay calm, rest and rejuvenate
- Find a new hobby that does not involve technology
- Identify your mental, emotional and physical strengths and work with them
- Talk to a trusted adult - this means your homeroom teacher, class teacher, Dean, counsellor or Director of Wellbeing

RESPONSIBILITY

Uniform

- You are required attend remote classes in school uniform - this can be either winter or sports uniform

Attendance

- You are to attend homeroom daily at 8:45 - 8:55am
- You are to attend class by following your timetable - lessons may be via goggle classroom or zoom
- If you are unwell, you must speak to your parent/guardian who will need contact the College regarding your absence for the day

- Report behaviours that breach College expectations to your Dean



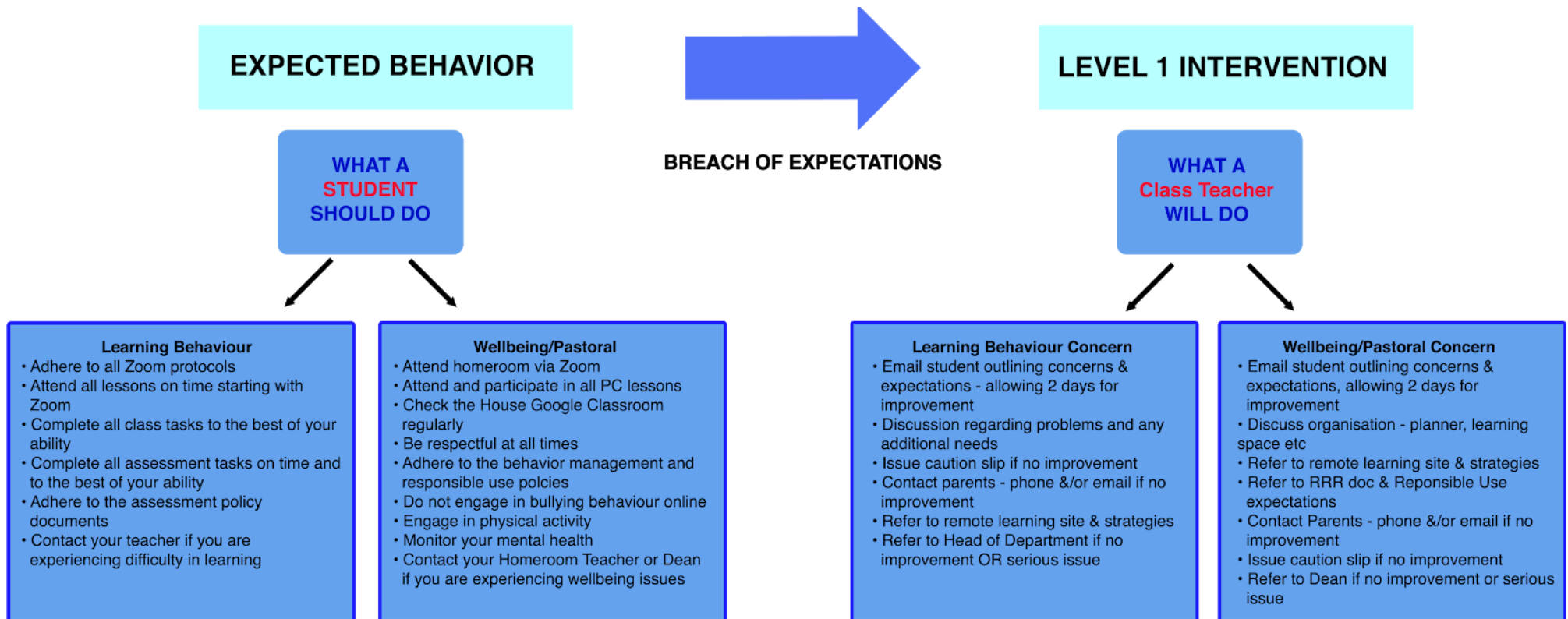
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Behaviour Management: Incident and Consequence Chart
